




At All Saints' CE Primary, we are 'Children of God'. We wear our crowns with pride.









To celebrate Number Day, the children at All Saints' took part in a huge range of maths activities, puzzles and games which promoted a positive, 'can-do' attitude towards maths and proved how fun and meaningful maths can be.







In the afternoon, the children did Maths through P.E. They took part in dice warm up games, they made equations based on how many bean bags they could throw into a hoop and played a game which involved getting into groups based on 'number of legs'- six legs = three children. 

The children listened to some fun number songs and performed actions to them for PE and also took part in the NSPCC Buddy Maths Number Challenge. Jackson and Liza were superstars at putting the jigsaw pieces together and helping Buddy.





<u>Year 2</u> enjoyed reading a new book about what can happen in the natural world within a second, minute, hour, day and so on. Then they tried some practical activities outside to see what they could do in one minute. They also enjoyed some outdoor games based on direction and position.

In class, they had a great time using their Maths skills when playing a variety of Maths games.









Year 3 had a fun morning getting involved in Number day. The children looked at equivalent fractions, drawing picture to help them with their application. They were also treated to a super numberbased nursery rhyme quiz created by Mrs Holmes! In the afternoon maths was incorporated into art; the children had to measure accurate shapes to help them to create Mayan mask. They also did some careful measuring of their triple jumps in PE.













<u>Year 4</u> had a terrific morning playing frisbee golf in PE counting how many throws to get through each hoop then board games based around number. They finished the morning off with a story book about division with remainders!



They also enjoyed solving Buddy's Challenge and sharing some mathsbased stories before home time.

























INSPIRE

This year's Number Day was inspired by the NSPCC and the vital job that they do at supporting and keeping children safe.









The children learnt how it is really important to speak out to a trusted adult or grown up if they are ever worried, upset or need to talk. We talked about Childline, and how it is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, to listen to children and young people, whatever their worry, whenever they need help or have a problem they feel they can't talk to anyone else about.

In total, All Saints' raised over £120 to donate to NSPCC, a great effort in the current circumstances!
