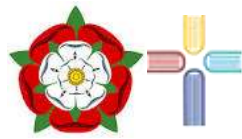


Autumn Term at Tudor Church of England Primary School

We had had some amazing art produced by our children this term thanks to our art teachers Mrs Sayers and Mrs Mansfield. Some of which is some sculptures in the style of Giacometti. In his work, Giacometti didn't sculpt the human body but the shadow it created. He often cast his sculptures in bronze, resulting in dark, mysterious piece.

At Tudor we are a rainbow of different people with various personalities and talents. Therefore rather than produce dark and gloomy shadows, some of our lower key stage 2 classes produced a rainbow of many colours representing our diverse school community.



In keeping with their topic about the Romans, upper key stage 2 have created some roman style pendants from clay and leather string. They are also proudly displayed in the corridor at Tudor.
