This term at Eyke C of E Primary we are very excited by the wonderful refurbishment our library. The new space was funded by grants from the MAT, the County Council and by fundraising by our PTA and it is a joy for us all. Parents and grandparents have bought lots of lovely new books and this has been coupled with a new “reading scheme” which focuses on developing the children’s fluency from Year 2 and on through KS2. The library is another indicator of how much reading is valued at Eyke.



One of the important aspects of education at Eyke is advancing the children's Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development and one way we do this is through the children's committee work. Through our committees we work to engage and empower pupils as agents of change at school and in our community so that they understand they can be part of making a difference in the world. As the children move through the school we hope that they can start to understand the root causes of poverty and injustice, as well as fundamental British values. We currently have 7 committees at school: School Council, Restorative Justice Committee, Play Leaders, Collective Worship Team, Health and Safety Committee, Wellbeing Committee and Eco Committee and all pupils from Year 1 upwards belong to one of them. This term the committees have presented assemblies on Fire Safety, pioneers in shaping Black history, the Christian value of Generosity and Mental Health and all the committees have written action plans for the year. Yesterday the School Council led a very moving Remembrance Service at All Saints church.
