The Archbishop of Canterbury anointed the King with Holy Oil that came from Jerusalem. Once the King had been anointed, he was presented with the Coronation Regalia which included:

Once King Charles had received the

Crown Jewels he was crowned and he moved from the very old St Edmund's Throne, to the new throne that had been made for him.







It was then the turn of Queen Camilla. She was anointed by the Archbishop of Canterbury and was presented with her own Sceptre, made by **Potter Class**.

After she was crowned, she sat on her throne, next to King Charles.






After the Coronation Service, the King and Queen travelled from Westminster Abbey to Buckingham Palace in the Gold State Coach, made by **Rashford Class**.
